

SHORT CURRICULUM VITAE PROFESSOR JAMES FLETT



James Flett is deputy to the Director of the European Commission Legal Service WTO Team. He has been practicing international trade law for 30 years. He spent several years working for two international law firms, before joining the Commission Legal Service in 1995, when the WTO was founded. He has represented the EU in 220 WTO proceedings. He teaches WTO law at Leuven University, WTO Subsidies Law at the World Trade Institute (Bern) and WTO Dispute Settlement Law at the Academy of International Economic Law and Policy (AIELPO). He regularly speaks at international conferences on WTO law and has published widely on the subject.

Mr. Flett has delivered lectures or spoken at conferences on WTO law at: Leuven University, The London School of Economics and Political Science, University College London, The British Institute of International and Comparative Law, Harvard University, Cambridge University (The Lauterpacht Centre for International Law), Manchester University, Birmingham University, Amsterdam University, Maastricht University, The European University Institute (Florence), The World Trade Institute (Berne), Stockholm University, The University of Hong Kong, The Graduate Institute (Geneva), The Academy of European Law (Brussels), Zagreb University, Madrid University, The Indian Institute of Foreign Trade, the Global Public Policy Institute, Carnegie India, the University of Gothenburg, Edinburgh University and The Max Planck Institute for Procedural Law (Luxembourg).
